Welcome to Storey's Field Centre, a new community centre for Eddington, the city and the surrounding area. Keep in touch, join our mailing list or follow us on social media.

We hope that you will discover us using sustainable transport. We are connected to the city cycle network. Eddington is on the Universal Bus route (www.go-whippet.co.uk), Citi 4/X3 bus to Madingley Park and Ride or the Citi 5 and Citi 6 to Huntingdon Road.

We advise anyone driving to the Centre to park at Madingley Road Park and Ride, which is free (for up to 18 hours) and only a 5-10 minute walk away. Parking charges in Eddington apply 8am-6pm Monday to Friday and 10am-5pm Saturday to Sunday (including public holidays). The majority of spaces have a maximum stay of 2 hours and no return within 1 hour, there are some spaces on site with a maximum stay of 4 hours. There is disabled parking on site for Blue Badge holders. Please notes that users of on street parking must get a ticket from the ticket machine on arrival. Parking charges in Eddington apply 8am-6pm Monday to Friday (including public holidays) and 10am-5pm Saturday to Sunday (including public holidays). The majority of spaces have a maximum stay of 2 hours and no return within 1 hour, there are some spaces on site with a maximum stay of 4 hours. There is disabled parking on site for Blue Badge holders
